NAMIKANGO MISSION

MALAWI

Malawi is among the poorest countries on the surface of Earth. While Malawi recently enjoyed a few years of uncommon boost in harvest, it is slowly declining back into unconceivable poverty. Inconsistent rainfall has made farming difficult, causing a food crisis. Malawi continues to struggle to feed her people, despite the government's efforts in the past 12 years.

In this damaged society it is the orphans, HIV/AIDS victims, widows, and elderly that stand the most vulnerable. *Namikango Mission* has focused its efforts to reach such groups with the *Gleanings* soup mix. With support from *Malawi Project* and *Kinder Kanker Genezing*, *Namikango Mission* has distributed the soup mix to 17,500 people throughout Malawi.

The first people to receive food were in a support group for HIV/AIDS, formed at the *Namikango Maternity Clinic*. They meet twice a month, always joined by a Bible teacher from *Namikango's* Bible School, to share God's Word. Each one of them is living with HIV/AIDS. Due to the virus, they are physically weak and cannot work to produce enough food for their families; neither do they have access to loans to start small businesses. Because of this, many members of the support group

are driven into abject poverty. Needless to say, the response was positive when one day after the message the food was handed out to the 65 members. The soup provides the diet they need to safely take their medication and live a better life.



Memory Chimtengo

Memory Chimtengo (named changed) is a 19 year old girl. She says that sometimes getting the diet she needs to avoid problems with the medication for her HIV is impossible. Memory has lost both parents, living with an old grandparent, and is still in Primary School. "Cultivating enough food to last the whole year is a problem," she says. "During lean months, we sometimes go to bed without taking any food." Her circumstances have brought discrimination and no support. She is extremely happy to have received the dry soup mix, which provides the balanced diet she needs.
